TEACHER TRAINING IN CIVIL DIALOGUE: A COMPETENCY OF CITIZENSHIP

This summer professional development program will equip grade 7-12 teachers with strategies in teaching and modeling civil dialogue. Civil dialogue is a vital civic competency that can help us live well together, even with deep differences. Civil dialogue is not debate. It is a process of seeking understanding by communicating with respect and listening with empathy.

Teachers will also explore Utah's changing demographics and learn how to recognize and counter their own personal bias. Each teacher will gain access to four digital Utah-based student-facing case studies that highlight civil dialogue and will hear from speakers featured in the case studies. Participants will be required to dedicate at least one class period Fall 2021 to practicing civil dialogue with their students and report on the experience. Lunch freely provided. Optional tours of UVU's Reflection Center and Roots of Knowledge stained glass exhibit will immediately follow the program.
